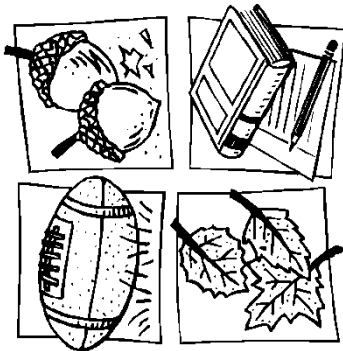

SALUTATIONS FROM SHAWN

Conforming, Reforming, Transforming

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. –Romans 12:1-2

Change is nothing new to the church. The life of Jesus led to a dramatic shift in the Jewish community and a new religion emerged. After an extended period of persecution by Rome, Emperor Constantine converted to Christianity, signaling a major transition as Christianity became a state religion. In 1054, the Eastern Orthodox Church and the Holy Roman Catholic Church split in the Great Schism. Roughly 500 years later the Protestant Church separated from the Catholic Church in the Great Reformation. Now it seems that yet another era of change is with us as distinctive cultural shifts impact the church, leading to what church historian Phyllis Tickle described as the "Great Emergence." She said, "Christianity is in the midst of a new reformation that will radically remake the faith."

We no longer live in Christendom, where Christianity is the dominant, influential religion. That may be a blessing as we can no longer assume people know about Jesus' message. Our witness to the joy of following Jesus is more important than ever, shining like a light on a hill, as we offer our service to God.

The 12th chapter of the Apostle Paul's letter to the Church at Rome teaches us how to live in God's service. When we offer ourselves as a living sacrifice to God, we engage in true worship. Instead of conforming to the world's standards, we allow God to transform us into the image of Christ.

As Jesus transforms us, we are empowered to transform the world. With sincere love, when we serve God with a heart full of devotion, hope will keep us joyful. Through faith, we can conquer evil with good as God reveals heaven on earth.

This spring, the First United Church of Christ celebrated 195 years of serving God. This fall Protestantism will celebrate its 500th anniversary. Through the thousands of years since Jesus Christ walked this earth, the power of the Holy Spirit has been working through us, as the Holy Spirit will continue to work through us for thousands of year to come.

We need not fear change for through it God transforms the world.

Confirmation Organizational Meeting Sunday, September 10, after Worship, Weiser Board Room

A new format is planned for Confirmation Class this year as church members share their knowledge and interests with the confirmands, joining Pastor Shawn in guiding the class.

First Church invites young people in seventh grade and older to affirm their baptism through the Rite of Confirmation. Through baptism, they were welcomed into the worldwide community of the Christian Church. Through confirmation, or catechism, young people are invited to grow in faith in God, seeking God through the teachings of Jesus Christ and the guidance of the Holy Spirit, knowing they are loved, not just by their parents and grandparents, but by their brothers and sisters in Christ and, most importantly, by God.

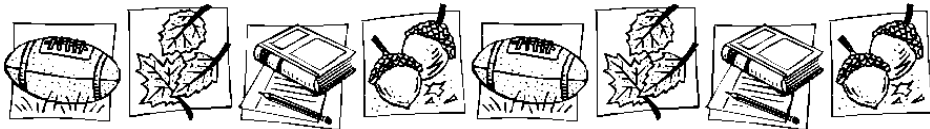
