SALUTATIONS FROM SHAWN

Judgment or Joy?

Welcoming a child into the world is a time filled with anticipation and joy. Yet in addition to the beautiful stories leading up to the birth of Jesus, Advent scriptures offer dire warning of the second coming of Jesus, when he will return to earth to judge all people. The question left hanging in the air is: will we be found worthy of salvation or will we be rejected as half-hearted followers?

Yet even in the predictions of judgment, there is a word of promise. We do not know the hour or day when the Second Coming of Christ will occur, but we can trust that God has given us the spiritual gifts we need as we wait. With hope, we wait for God's promise that a new heaven and new earth will emerge where righteousness prevails. As we wait, like John the Baptizer, we can prepare the way of the Lord when we testify to the light of Christ casting out the darkness and fear in our lives.

The good news is that nothing is impossible with God: a vulnerable infant can save the world from evil; a single human being can redeem all of humanity through a sacrificial act of love; and a faithful girl can bear the Word of God made flesh. Indeed, through the power of God we can all bear the Word of God as we proclaim Jesus Christ the Savior of all people.

During the busy Advent season of preparation, let's take some time to share the good news with others. Everyone needs to know that "*the grace of God has appeared, bringing forgiveness and salvation to all, teaching us to renounce sinfulness and impure passions, to live lives that are disciplined, righteous, and holy, while we wait for the blessed hope of the glorious day when Jesus Christ will appear.*" (Titus 2:11-13, paraphrased)

What a joyful judgment that is for us and for the world!

Seeking Hope, Joy, Love and Peace

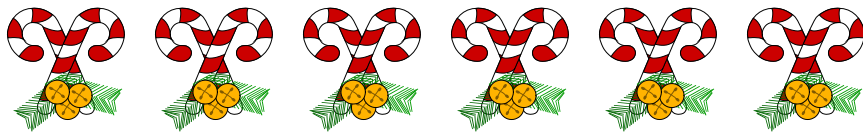

The holiday season isn't joyful for everyone. For people who have experienced the death of a loved one, the loss of a job, the pain of illness or a broken relationship, depression is not an uncommon experience over the holidays. During worship on December 10, the Second Sunday of Advent, we will offer a service for healing of those who struggle to find hope, as we remember that God provides light even in darkness.

MISSION

Giving Tuesday: Thanksgiving is followed by "Black Friday", "Small Business Saturday" (Nov 25: shop locally to support our community), and "Cyber Monday" for those who buy online. "Giving Tuesday" on Nov 28 is designated as a day to give to charities working to feed the hungry, to fight disease, to support veterans, and more. A charitable contribution to honor family or friends might be the perfect gift. Visit "Charity Navigator" or "giving.org" to verify legitimate charities & how they use donations.

Angel Tree Gifts: Gift cards are hanging on the Angel Tree in the Narthex for children from the Salvation Army, the Gaudenzia Treatment Center and for two local families. The cards note the age and gender of the children along with clothing size and wish list. Gift cards would also be welcomed for the parents. In addition, cards will list food items needed for a Christmas meal. The 2020 Vision Plan was updated "to effect for God and for good the lives of all people living in southeast Pennsylvania" and beyond by strengthening local churches and pastors.
