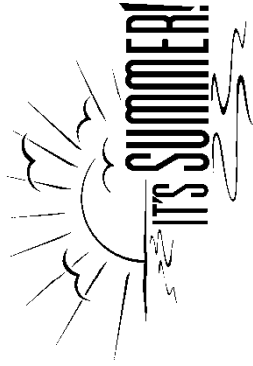

SALUTATIONS FROM SHAWN

Telling Truth?

Truth in our culture can be hard to determine. We are overwhelmed with information, through television, tweets, Facebook and other sources. Unfortunately much of what is "shared" is not checked for accuracy. What we accept as true depends on how we see and interpret the world, influenced by multi-media as well as our education, religion, politics, experience, family and friends...and we tend to listen only to sources that agree with us!

With honesty and humility, we can all admit that we don't know the truth with a capital "T." Only God has an unbiased perspective on truth. To know the difference between "fact" and "fake" we can turn to the principles of justice and righteousness voiced by the prophets of the Bible. This summer we'll listen to the wisdom of the 12 "Minor Prophets". As we read their major messages, it will be clear that they were not immune to the prejudice of their time. Yet in their desire to serve God, Truth was revealed by the prophets.

The prophets dealt with the life of the Jewish people between the eighth and fourth centuries BCE. Split into two nations after the reign of Solomon, the people and their leaders gradually turned from God and disaster followed. The northern kingdom of Israel fell to the Assyrian dynasty. The southern kingdom of Judah was conquered by Babylon. The leaders of the two nations were taken into exile hundreds of miles from God's Promised Land to prevent rebellion and to acquire Israel's wealth.

Through these trials, God's prophets spoke against injustice, exploitation, greed, pride and complacency. They challenged the people to worship the one true God, rather than the idols of their own creation. Yet once their prophecies of dire warning were fulfilled, they immediately offered comfort and hope. God's anger waned for God is compassionate and forgiving.

"You hate the one who reproves in the gate, and you abhor the one who speaks the truth. Therefore because you trample on the poor and take from them levies of grain, you have built houses of hewn stone, but you shall not live in them." –Amos 5:10-11

"Those who worship vain idols forsake their true loyalty." –Jonah 2:7-8

"These are the things that you shall do: Speak peace, do not devise evil in your hearts against one another, and love no false oath; for all these...I hate, says the Lord...therefore love truth and peace." –Zechariah 8:16-18

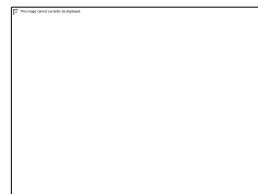
