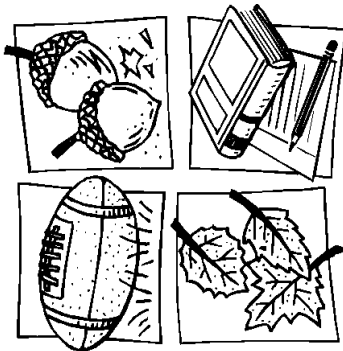

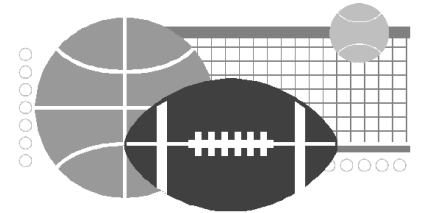

SALUTATIONS FROM SHAWN

Holy Everyday Words for Sacred Ordinary Days

Language is a gift of God, whether we offer praises in worship or talk to our friends at a football game. In his book, *Tell It Slant*, biblical scholar Eugene Peterson notes, "Every time we open our mouths, whether in conversation with one another or in prayer to our Lord, Christian truth and community are on the line."

His book title comes from a poem by Emily Dickinson:

*Tell the Truth but tell it slant –
Success in Circuit lies
Too bright for our infirm Delight
The Truth's superb surprise*

Dickinson suggests that God's words are too wonderful for us to grasp outright. We do better when the Truth "dazzles gradually..."

God's Word of Truth, revealed in Jesus, the Word made flesh, is told through stories of everyday conversations about ordinary events cast in holy light so that we might be dazzled gradually. Jesus teaches us to speak in a way that honors God, so the sacred is made evident in a way that lifts one another up.

Our lives are not divided into the religious and secular: we always live in the presence of God. As Peterson writes, *"The same God we address in prayer and proclaim in sermons is also deeply, eternally involved in (our) conversation, whether casually or intentionally. But not always obviously. God's words are not always prefaced by 'Thus says the Lord.' It takes time and attentiveness to make connections between the said and the unsaid, the direct and the indirect, the straightforward and the oblique... I want to nurture an awareness of the sanctity of words, the holy gift of language...whether it is directed vertically or horizontally. Just as Jesus did."*

In other words, the prayers we offer to God and the conversations we have with one another are connected. We cannot push God out of our ordinary, everyday speech. Why would we want to!

Whether we are at school or work, at play or rest, Jesus' stories call us to speak in the name of God, with language that honors one another and glorifies the Word of God.

Ask for What You Need: Prayer Vigil for Children September 11 through October 23

During the annual Prayer Vigil for Children you are invited to pray for:

- Children who are left out; afraid; disabled; ill; bullied; and poor.
- Children in our church and community; this nation; and God's world.

The teens and children of our congregation will lead us in worship on October 23 as we conclude the Prayer Vigil for Children. If you would like to share a specific concern for children, please talk to Pastor Shawn.

Children and Communion

As a church we want to encourage our children to walk by faith. As the Heidelberg Catechism notes, *"It is by faith alone that we share in Christ and all his blessings: where then does that faith come from? The Holy Spirit produces it in our hearts by the preaching of the holy gospel, and confirms it through our use of the holy sacraments."* (Q&A 65) Parents know when their children come to believe in Christ, so at First UCC parents determine when their children are able to receive communion. Children are strongly encouraged to participate in Children's Church to learn more about the Christian faith and sacraments in preparation for confirmation class in seventh and eighth grades. Pastor Shawn will offer a brief "first communion" talk after worship on September 25 for any children who are prepared to receive their first communion on World Communion Sunday, October 2.

CONFIRMATION

Confirmation Organizational Meeting Sunday, September 11, after Worship Weiser Board Room

First Church invites young people in seventh grade and older to affirm their baptism through the Rite of Confirmation. Through baptism, they were welcomed into the worldwide community of the Christian Church. Through confirmation, also known as catechism, young people are invited to grow in faith in God, seeking to know God in their lives through the teachings of Jesus Christ and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Confirmation prepares young people to proclaim their faith publicly, knowing they are loved, not just by their parents and grandparents, but by their brothers and sisters in Christ and, most importantly, by God.

An organizational meeting for first and second year confirmands and their parents will be held Sunday, September 11, in the Weiser Board Room after worship. Please bring your school and special activities schedule so that we can select a weekly meeting time.

The confirmation process at First Church is a two year program. Confirmands are required to:

- attend worship on a weekly basis,
- attend weekly confirmation class,
- and participate in periodic service projects.

Avoiding Charity Scams

The vast majority of charities in the United States follow both IRS regulations and the law. However, a very small number of fraudulent entities and scams undercut public trust by posing as real charities. Unfortunately, many of the scams pretend to raise funds for veterans. You can research the legitimacy of charities by checking with watch groups like CharityWatch, Charity Navigator and Guidestar to learn more about the organization: is it registered with the IRS, what percentage of donations actually goes for assistance, how much does the CEO make, what are net assets? The answers will help you determine if the charity is worthy of your support.

Respecting Grief in the Technology Age (By Taya Dunn Johnson)

When someone dies, those closest to the deceased need time. Give the immediate family at least 24 hours to handle the urgent and time-sensitive matters related to death. Allow immediate family to be the first to post information on social media. Your love and expressions of support are appreciated and needed, but they can create unintended additional stress if offered too soon.

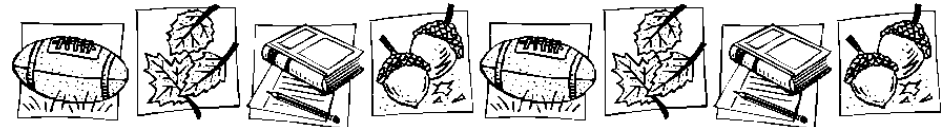

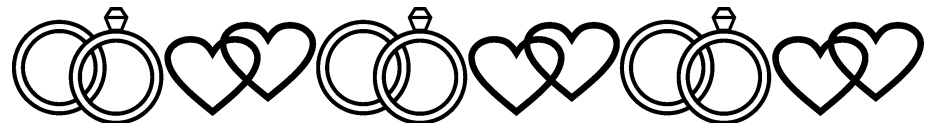
