O the joy of being a child on Easter, hunting for Easter eggs with my sisters and cousins, looking at least three times under each bush or cushion, if it was raining, to make sure we found every egg. Still long after Easter my grandfather once told us with a smile in his eye that he smelled something strange one day and with his nose managed to hunt out the colored egg, now rotting in the deepest corner of the couch, which we all missed months earlier.

Those were the days! Bruce Springsteen sang about them, calling them "Glory Days", reminiscing about the star athlete, the prom queen, the people who reached the pinnacle of success when they were young and could never find the same acclaim as they grew older.

Looking back with regret, we might say philosophically, "All good things come to an end." But it's not true. Easter never ends. Fit First 2019: Challenge Walk to Jerusalem. In keeping with our Life Balance approach and Love Diet, we are renewing our summer walk to Jerusalem. It's 5,750 miles between Schuylkill Haven and Jerusalem. Most people can walk a mile in about 20 minutes. If a person walked seven miles a week, starting May 1 and ending August 31, that would add up to 123 miles. We'll pool our miles at the end of the summer to see if we made it to Jerusalem. If even half of our members participate in the challenge, we could easily total 20,000 miles while feeling much better at summer's end. Join as we walk to where Jesus walked!

20 HOUR FAMINE: JUST HUNGER – rescheduled due to the flu
Hunger isn't just. But your hunger can be.

Friday, May 17, 6:30 PM - Saturday, May 18, 3:30 PM

Every five seconds, a child under 5 dies—and nearly half those deaths are from hunger-related causes. That's why we're taking action now! Through games, videos and the Bible we will learn about hunger and ways we can eradicate it. We have the option of fasting completely or eating the kind of food available to people who live in poverty. We'll end the event with communion as we remember that we are fed physically and spiritually by God. Youth will need to register for the event, providing a parental permission slip with medical insurance information. **Advanced registration is required by Sunday, May 12.** Check Sunday bulletins for additional information. Participants need to be 12 years or older. **Each participant is asked to raise at least \$40,** enough to feed a child for one month and just \$2 for every hour of the famine. \$480 is needed to feed and care for one child for a year. See Pastor Shawn for Fund raising kits.
