SALUTATIONS FROM SHAWN

I'm Still Wondering

Freed from slavery in Egypt, the people of Israel headed out into the desert with confidence. After all, God had parted the waters of the Red Sea for their safe escape from the Egyptian army. God would take care of them.

Their wandering in the wilderness soon turned to wondering, however, and then outright concern. Where would they find food and, most importantly, water in this wasteland? With so much uncertainty in their lives, their thoughts returned to what they knew. While they were slaves in Egypt, they had access to food and water. They began to yearn for the past even though it had been pure torture.

In the past seven months, we've also dealt with great uncertainty. We would like our lives to get back to normal. Like the Israelites, I think we will find significant and permanent changes ahead. Like the Israelites, we have a choice: yearn for the past or trust that God is leading us to new beginnings.

As a church, it's been obvious for some time that our typical way of being church isn't working. We've kept the church doors open, but we haven't found a way to invite people to walk through those doors to become part of the people of God at First UCC, to join in our mission of service to God and others.

Rather than worry in this time of wondering, we should rejoice. In this in-between time, this interim time, as we leave behind what we know and learn new ways to be the church, God has gifted us with opportunity. God has given us time to explore our call to and our mission in Christian service.

At times we may feel we are being pushed or shoved into the unknown. Living with uncertainty may feel chaotic. Even so I believe we should embrace this time with joy and enthusiasm. This is a time for spiritual growth, for listening to God, and for following Jesus' commandment to love God, neighbor and self in new ways. We are entering a new time when people will be connected to the church through social media and through service in the community.

Join me in the discomfort and chaos of this transitional time. Through the story of the Israelites in the wilderness, we can see in advance the fears and chaos which may accompany this time. We may find ourselves wondering what the future will bring. Yet we can also see that God led the people all the time, through every difficulty, to the Promised Land. Let's trust in God to do a new thing with us as *we serve God through Christ and serve others with love.*

In Person Worship
