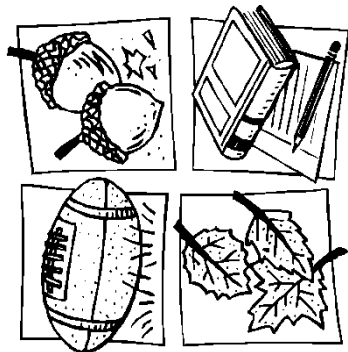

SALUTATIONS FROM SHAWN

Given a Future with Hope

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans for good and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope." – Jeremiah 29:11

Jeremiah had a difficult life. As a young man, God called him to tell his people their faithlessness was leading to destruction. His hometown rejected him, he was thrown in a cistern with the hope it would rain causing him to drown, and no one except two people even listened to him.

We can relate. Our lives have been difficult lately. There is no need to itemize the events of the last two and one-half years; you know what I mean.

Yet we have discovered, just like Jeremiah, that God's plans for us are for good. We are emerging from a time of fear and uncertainty. While life will always surprise us with the unexpected, sometimes in a worrisome way, we can be certain that God will care for us.

Take the southern kingdom of Judah as an example. Judah sinned against God. Although the northern kingdom of Israel had already fallen to the Babylonian Empire since they refused to follow God's word, Judah continued to worship wealth and power rather than God, choosing profits over the care of their neighbors. Judah still claimed to be God's chosen people, assuming it could break its covenant with God while God would be required to keep promises. Their betrayal led to Judah's destruction and to exile in Babylon.

God did not desert them even when they abandoned God. Instead, God made a new covenant with Israel and with Judah, writing this new covenant not on stone but on human hearts. Jesus came to earth to fulfill God's promises to Abraham, Moses, David, and the prophets. God's judgment would be tempered by grace and forgiveness. Through Jesus, all people are blessed with the gift of knowing and following God.

Our pandemic exile has ended. God's plans for the future and for us are good. God gives us hope. Thanks be to God!

For forty years, the prophet Jeremiah warned the people of Judah they would suffer the same fate unless they changed their behavior and obeyed God. Nobody listened. "Your wickedness will punish you, and your apostasies will convict you; the fear of me is not in you, says the Lord God of hosts." (2:19) Despite the prolonged, dire warnings, God also said, "I know the plans I have for you, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope." (29:11) Maybe there is hope for us as well.

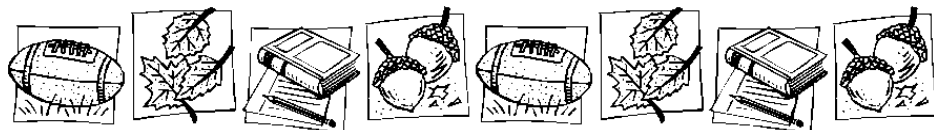
Do you need filling for your Thanksgiving dinner or do you just need to restock your freezer? An order form will be in the October/November newsletter.

Boiler Fund. The congregation adopted a three year plan in 2019 to replace \$37,000 borrowed from the Kline Fund for our new boilers. Every two seconds someone in America needs blood. Council holds a Bloodmobile for the American Red Cross every other month at Jerusalem Lutheran Church. A person can donate blood every 56 days. The donor's body replenishes the fluid lost from donation in about 24 hours. You must be at least 17 years of age, weigh at least 110 pounds and be healthy in order to donate blood. One pint of blood can save up to three lives.

SUICIDE PREVENTION

September is National Suicide Prevention Awareness Month

Suicide is a taboo topic; we are uncomfortable talking about death, especially when someone ends their own life. Talking about suicide is the best way to prevent it, however. Warning signs of someone at risk for suicide: extreme depression, guilt, or shame; hopelessness; talking about, or preoccupation with, death or suicide; preparing for death; a dramatic change in behavior, including withdrawal from friends; increased alcohol/drug use; difficulties in sleeping or eating; and decreased self-care. If you believe someone needs help, follow the **ACE** suicide prevention model.

Ask, "Are you thinking of killing yourself?" People having thoughts of suicide feel relief when someone asks them in a caring way.

Care by actively listening and engaging, without judgment.

Escort – When someone acknowledges they are feeling suicidal, connect them to the nearest resource. Visit the nearest Emergency Room. Call 9-8-8, the new number for the [National Suicide Prevention Lifeline](#) 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and follow their guidance. Let's talk about suicide to end it.
