SALUTATIONS FROM SHAWN

Wonder Full and Good

In a recent interview, after discussing the problems of the world including the war in Gaza and immigration issues, journalist Norah O'Donnell asked Pope Francis what gives him hope. He told her "Everything. You see tragedies, but you also see so many beautiful things. You see heroic mothers, heroic men, men who have hopes and dreams, women who look to the future. People want to live. And people are fundamentally good. We are all fundamentally good. Yes, there are some rogues and sinners, but the heart is good."

Sometimes it's hard to believe that people are fundamentally good. Driving down the road, we are cut off by aggressive drivers. Sharing our thoughts with others, we find rejection, as if it is impossible to disagree and remain civil let alone friends. Drug abuse is rampant as people try to solve mental health issues or simply disappear from the challenges of daily life. Dysfunction seems to be anchored in every aspect of society. Where is the good?

The Book of Genesis tells us that when God created the heavens and the earth, God saw that it was good. God saw that light was good, that vegetation was good, that day and night were good, that fish and birds and living creatures of every kind were good. When God created humankind, male and female in God's image, God saw everything that was made and it was very good. When God finished, God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, resting from all the work of creating.

This summer let's engage in God's world, looking at all the wonderful life God has made, amazed that we are invited to be part of this daily miracle. Let's look for all the good God places before us. If we look with faith, we will see God's blessings given to us to share with one another, full of wonder at all that is good. God is good, all the time. All the time, God is good. That is hope.

And for heaven's sake, let's prioritize rest! After all, God did.

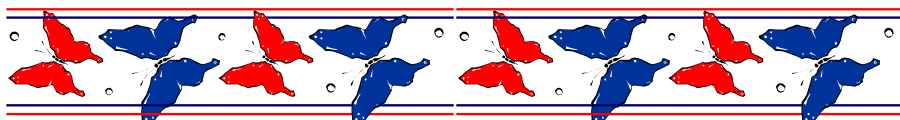

Consistory Planning – Your Opinions Needed and Valued

Receiving the request from Schuylkill County Chorus to share church space started a conversation at the May Consistory meeting. Are there other ways in which the church could better serve the community? As the large building sits largely empty during the week, we still pay utilities and upkeep for the space. Could it host small groups, perhaps another AA meeting, a single parents' support group, or children's activities?

Naturally, the conversation included the absence of children in worship and Children's Church. How can we as a church of Jesus Christ reach out to families with children to include them in faith life? In our busy society, parents often feel they have little time to spend with their children. Relaxing together on Sunday morning, even if it means skipping church, feels like the best option. Could we as a church adjust our worship, with less time devoted to sitting and listening inactively which is not conducive to children? Could we find ways to do the work of the church during worship rather than simply being the church?

Weekender Food Program for Schuylkill Haven Elementary

The Schuylkill Haven Council of Churches, working with local businesses and organizations, strives to cover the cost of the Weekender food program for Schuylkill Haven Area Elementary School children. About 80 children participate in the program which allows them to take home food for the weekend if their homes experience food shortage. Helping Harvest Food Bank provides the food, with an estimated cost of \$20,000 for the 2024-25 school year. (Blue Mountain School District's Weekend Program is funded fully already.)

Keystone Conference

The four Pennsylvania UCC Conferences will meet in State College June 7-9 to discern whether they should become one. Conversations about merging began with the four Conference Ministers in January 2022. They identified the urgency of issues confronting the church: the divisions and hostilities of our world, our responsibility to answer Jesus' prayer, 'that they may all be one,' the spiritual hunger of people and pastors, and the call to support and develop the local church. Now the PA UCC is looking at new ways to serve Jesus and our churches by drawing on the strength and gifts of clergy, congregations, leaders, and conference staff. After the June meeting more information will be shared. The association and local churches will see little if any change.

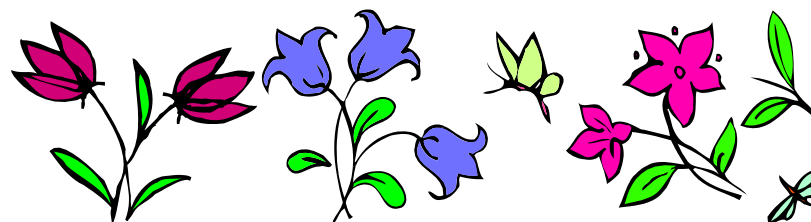
